

Information for Incarcerated Fathers

Children who have a father in prison need support from their family and their community. They are affected by the incarceration of their fathers in many ways. These children are often confused and sad. They struggle with whom to talk to about their lives, and they worry about the future. As an incarcerated father, you and your child's caregiver can work together to connect your child to the resources he or she may need to better adjust to your incarceration, to do well in school, and to prepare for the future.

Mentors can help children of incarcerated parents in many ways. Through Mentoring Children of Prisoners: Caregiver's Choice your child can be matched with a caring adult mentor. The enclosed brochure discusses how a mentor can help your child and how the program works.

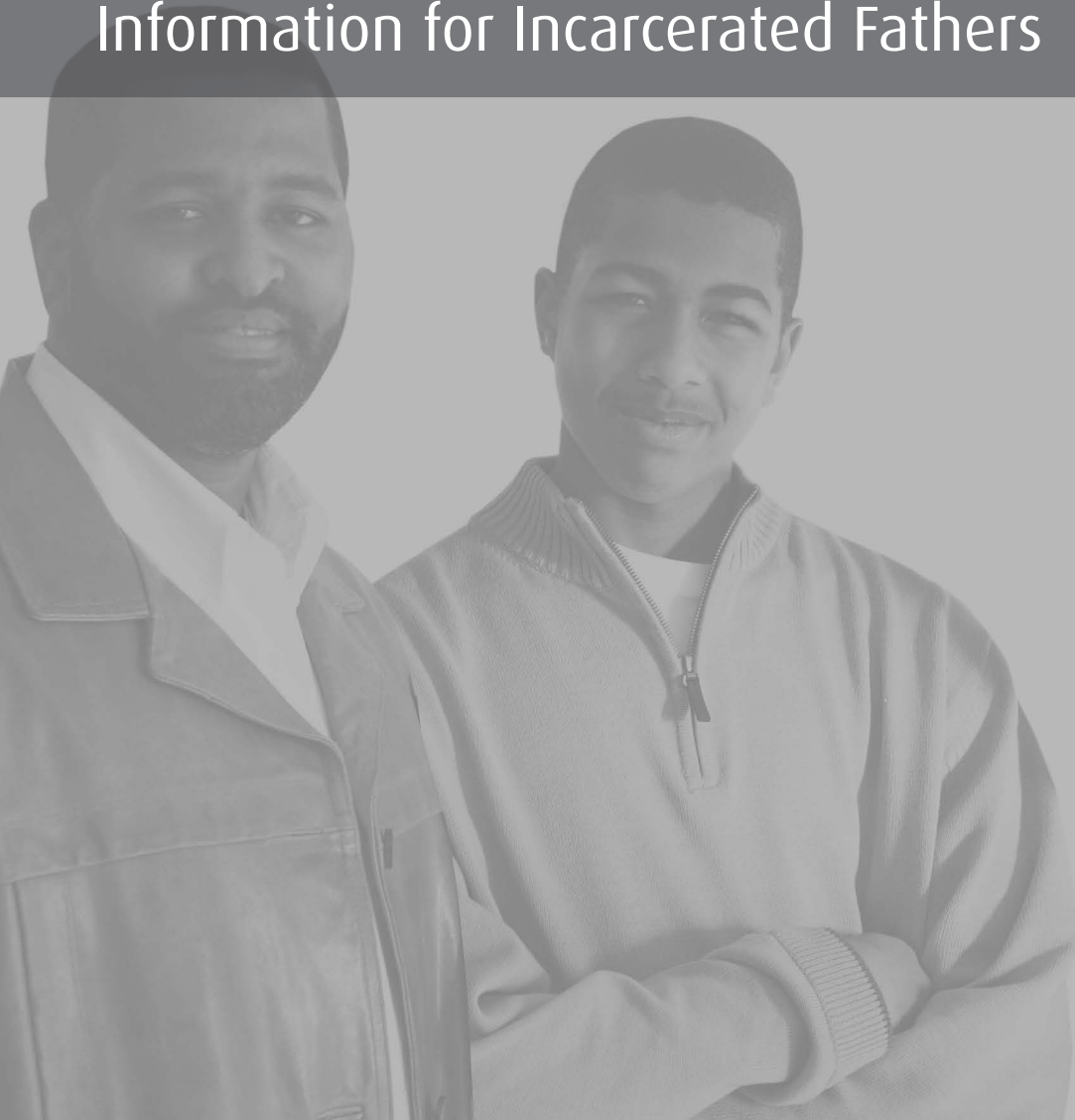
